We are putting together the indoor one net. The outdoor one will have the poppies tied with zip ties, courtesy of our Pathfinders/Rangers group (who know from experience that this works best outside). Around the world, various churches and organizations have organized "Poppy Projects".

Lynne Coull and Karen James have proposed doing something similar **around our Garden's Peace Pole** for this coming Fall. But it requires faithful knitters and crocheters to make it happen. Patterns are available at the back of the church, as well as some wool. And please let us know if you are participating - for the sake of mutual encouragement!

We already have many poppies created and donated! THANK YOU SO MUCH!! But we'd love more!! The Rangers who meet here Monday nights are learning to crochet, so that they can also contribute poppies!!
