

We at St. John's and Holy Trinity will be participating in the worldwide prayer movement known at "**Thy Kingdom Come**." Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to **pray from Ascension to Pentecost** (*June 1-8*) for more people to come to know Jesus.

Since it began in May 2016, God has grown TKC from a dream of possibility into a movement which unites more than a million Christians in prayer, in nearly 90% of countries worldwide, across 85 different denominations and traditions- so that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to faith in Jesus Christ.

Every person, household and church are encouraged to pray during the 11 days in their own way. It is our hope and prayer that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and His love for the world

will hear it for themselves and respond and follow Him. You yourself can join in by writing down the names of 5 people – family, friends, neighbours, colleagues – for whom you will pray during *Thy Kingdom Come*.
